

GRADE OPTION REQUESTS

CGS CAN ONLY PROCESS GRADE OPTION REQUESTS FOR CGS COURSES

Please read carefully:

UNIVERSITY POLICY:

Certain courses are offered on the S/NC (Satisfactory/No-Credit) grade option. This option was designed to encourage students to explore new and potentially difficult subjects without fear of the risks of failure. Under this option, a student who does satisfactory work (a grade of C or better) in a course receives the grade of S. If the student's work is not satisfactory (a grade of C- or lower), the grade of NC (No Credit) is given. Courses for which an S is received are counted toward graduation, but are not computed in the GPA. Courses in which an NC is received are counted toward neither graduation nor the GPA.

Implications:

- You could technically pass a class, receiving a C- or D range grade and still not receive credit for it when opting for the S/N grade. Because you will not be earning credits for these grades, the course cannot be applied to requirements.
- If you are graduating at the end of this semester and are seeking to change a course you need for elective or general education credit to the S/N grade option, you must earn a C or higher in this course in order for it to count toward graduation!
- Typically, courses taken with the S/N grade option CANNOT be applied to major requirements.
- In order to graduate with University Honors (i.e. Cum Laude), students must complete at least 60 credits in courses to which letter grades have been assigned.
- If you may, in the future, apply to graduate or professional school, competitive fellowships or programs, you should limit the number of S/N grades on your transcript. In some instances, schools or programs will consider "S" grades as equivalent to a "C" grade.
